This new little BYO restaurant is packed to the gills with Kemp Town types who love the informality, lovely service and its North African décor (though you can get your own from Inspirations on Lewes Rd). The starters are mouth watering and taste just like the real thing, but the tagines (and many of the meaty mains) are overpriced at around £12. and about as North African as my grandmother. Give it time though; with Mascara and Couscous House giving it a run for its money, the lamb will be falling off the bone and soaking up the prunes before you know it.

Apparently the delicious lamb agine, cooked with caramelised irunes, almonds and sesame seeds (12,95) is the best in town.

An Aladdin's cave of Algerian food with low lighting, rugs suspended from the ceiling and cushioned benches, Bedouin style. The menu offers the standard tagine, pastilla and couscous, with Rechta Zohra, a chicken with home made noodles. cinnamon, chick peas, carrot and turnip (£12) the only dish throwing us in to No Man's Land. The food is good: Pascal from La Fourchette is the main man and has a pedigree, but we've been spoilt by Moroccan chefs, and Pascal is not behind the decks here so we'll forgive the blandness and look at the big picture. There are not many places in Brighton where the service is spot on, the ambience perfect and the food just fine, and where you'll pay around £25 per head for the experience. Throw in the belly dancing after 9.30pm on Friday and Saturday, and you've got a winner.
